## Dates in History

On September 3rd, Spanish settlers laid claim to what became Los Angeles, now the second most populous U.S. city and the home to Hollywood, whose name is synonymous with the American motion-picture industry.

On September 7th, the United States got its 1813 nickname, Uncle Sam. The name is linked to Samuel Wilson, a meat packer from Troy, New York, who supplied barrels of beef to the United States Army during the War of 1812. Wilson (1766-1854) stamped the barrels with "U.S." for United States, but soldiers began referring to the grub as "Uncle Sam's."

In the late nineteenth century the women's 1893 suffrage movement was widespread throughout Northern Europe, America, Britain and its colonies. But on September 19th, the first self-governing country to grant all women the right vote was New Zealand.

On September 12th, near Montignac, France, 1940 a collection of prehistoric cave paintings was discovered by four teenagers who stumbled upon the ancient artwork after following their dog down a narrow entrance into a cavern. The 15,000 to 17,000-year-old paintings, consisting mostly of animal representations, are among the finest examples of art from the Upper Paleolithic period.

On the morning of September 11th, 19 2001 terrorists from the Islamist extremist group Al Queda hijacked 4 commercial aircraft and crashed two of them into the North and South towers of the World Trade Center complex in New York City. A third plane crashed into the Pentagon in Arlington, Virginia. After learning about the other attacks, passengers on the fourth hijacked plane, Flight 93, fought back, and the plane was crashed into an empty field in western Pennsylvania about 20 minutes by air from Washington, D.C.
